Ghaybah theory of al-Shaykh al-Ṭā'ifah al-Ṭūsī

Abū Ja'far Muḥammad b. al-Ḥasan b. 'Alī al-Ṭūsī, known as al-Shaykh al-Ṭā'ifah al-Ṭūsī was one of the most prominent Shī'ite scholars in the 11th century – Baghdād. Under the guidance of al-Shaykh al-Mufid and al-Sharīf al-Murtaḍá, he mastered all kinds of Shī'ite sciences and became their best successor in the field of theology and jurisprudence.

Following al-Mufid's request, he wrote a book on the subject of the occultation of the twelfth Imām, which is titled *Kitāb al-ghaybah*. In this work, he tried to make a comprehensive and common view about this subject within the Twelver-Imamite school. He vindicated the twelfth Imam's existence and his ghaybah mainly by using 'aql (reason) and put ḥadīth only secondary importance, that is the difference between al-Ṭūsī and his predecessors such as al-Nu 'mānī and Ibn Bābūyah.

Nevertheless, al-Ṭūsī used many kinds of related ḥadīth. We can see his originality in his method of using ḥadīth.
